## MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT Capital credits returned for third consecutive year

Recently, we returned \$2.2 million of margins back to those who were members in 1985 and 1986. We are pleased that money can go back to our members and into the communities we serve.

Because you receive energy from an electric cooperative, you are a member of a not-for-profit business. That means you are an owner of your cooperative, Blue Grass Energy.

Providing affordable energy is part of our mission. We have to think about expenses, overhead and other aspects of daily business, but when we have margins, we share them back with you and the communities we serve. It is part of the value you receive by being part of a cooperative.

Surplus revenues are assigned to your account annually. These margins are based on how much business you did with the cooperative during a particular year. Your account represents your ownership or equity in Blue Grass Energy. The money itself is reinvested in the cooperative until it is returned to you in the form of what we call capital credits. We've made investments on your behalf to improve the efficiencies and reliability of our system, which have allowed us to reach financial goals while offering competitive rates.

Blue Grass Energy charges just enough to cover expenses and a slight margin. Margins provide us with dollars to ensure the co-op's financial strength and allows us to meet the financial obligations of our lenders. These margins are reinvested in the co-op in the form of capital improvements, and they are used to reduce the need for borrowing 100% for those system improvements.

In the last three years, we have shared approximately \$6 million back to our members—which benefits our communities. Returning these margins is just one of the many ways we are making life better, the cooperative way.
