Make Thanksgiving memorable and safe

During holidays, the kitchen is the heart of the home. Help make this time memorable and safe with these kitchen safety tips.

Be sure electric cords are not dangling off the counter within easy reach of a child.

When deep-frying a turkey, set your deep fryer on level ground far away from the house, garage and shed. Do not put it on a wooden deck, near a woodpile or under a tree. The middle of a flat driveway away from cars is a good location.

Match your cookware to your burner size. Don't use a large pot on a small burner.

Don't leave stoves, ovens and ranges unattended—stay in the kitchen.

After your guests leave, make sure all cooking appliances are off and all candles are out.



Take the surprise out of your bill: Sign up for Levelized Billing

An old saying in Kentucky is, "If you don't like the weather, just wait a few hours and it will change."


Living in a region of the U.S. where the climate can change

drastically can cause electric usage to vary from month to month. We want to help members manage their energy so we offer a program called Levelized Billing.

Levelized Billing allows you to

average your monthly bill based on your current usage along with the previous 12 months. Then we bill you for that average amount—so you pay close to the same amount every month. There is no "settle-up" month because the amount is recalculated each month based on a rolling average.

In order to take advantage of Levelized Billing, you need to have been in your home for 12 months and have a zero balance. Visit bgenenergy.com or call today to sign up.

Their mission is to honor and empower the emotional wellness of these heroes through outdoor activities, programs and services that enable them to reconnect to nature's healing properties.

Each year, Blue Grass Energy chooses a charity to work with for the year. We partner with a local nonprofit organization that benefits the communities in which we live and serve. Our fundraising efforts for the entire year go to that cause. This year, we are partnering with the Kentucky Wounded Heroes.

You can make a difference with Pennies for Purpose

Pennies for Purpose is a way to help our neighbors and communities for just pennies each month. This program is funded by Blue Grass Energy members who round up their monthly electric bills to the nearest dollar; and will provide funding to charitable

causes across our 23-county service area.

You have the opportunity to round up your electric bill to the next dollar. For example, a \$64.89 bill would round up to an even \$65. By rounding up, the average yearly contribution would be approximately \$6.
