Honor Flight returns



HONOR FLIGHT KENTUCKY

Hundreds of patriotic, flag-waving citizens gave two local veterans—and 64 other Kentucky veterans—a welcome home on September 17 they will never forget. This date marked the return of Honor Flight Kentucky after the 2020 and 2021 trips were postponed by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Blue Grass Energy was honored to sponsor two veteran heroes: Malcomb Thomason of Cynthiana and Gary McComas of Richmond. This Honor Flight marks the 11th Honor Flight Kentucky Blue Grass Energy has sponsored along with Kentucky's Touchstone Energy Cooperatives.

The day included viewing the changing of the guard ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier at Arlington

National Cemetery in Arlington, Virginia. Honor Flight representatives participated in a wreath-laying service at the tomb. "I had two favorites of the day: visiting the Vietnam Memorial and watching the changing of the guard and wreath-laying ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier," says Thomason.

McComas says, "I've had a hard time putting my experience into words. It far surpassed my expectations." Honor Flight is a critical part of Blue Grass Energy's commitment to our community. It is a privilege to be able to fly these veterans to their memorials, and it's an opportunity to serve them in some small way to repay their service to our nation and our community.
